Our main "must do's" are to align classrooms with research and evidence-based practices based on the science of reading.

Phonological and phonemic awareness are critical foundation pieces for early years.

Reading and spelling are now being taught together.

Through the provincially negotiated contract, the Board is now able to recall laid off staff to areas where there is still current need. Through these dollars, permanent positions have now been posted.
